

Dear Prospective Craft Vendor,

Thanks for your interest in the Farmers' Market.

This year the Farmers' Market will again allow a limited number of craft vendors to sell at the market. Our total number of craft vendors allowed will be 15 (based on 20% of last year's total vendor numbers per market by-laws). As it was last year, the items craft vendors sell must meet certain criteria and will be juried before being accepted.

The craft committee consists of three current market members selected by the board. It will also include one board member and the market manager.

Jury Criteria

- Products should be agricultural related. Crafts depicting flowers, fruits, trees and herbs are appropriate. As are crafts that draw on traditional cottage arts such as weaving, soap making, etc. The most unique items that we feel will appeal to farmers' market customers will be selected.
- All products must be handmade by you. Commercially made items are not appropriate, nor are used items.
- You must have a state of Idaho tax ID#. You can get a tax number from the State of Idaho Tax commission, 611 Wilson, Pocatello (236-6244).
- You must go through the jury process each year you wish to sell. If you are accepted one year it does not automatically guarantee your acceptance the next.
- Send up to 3 photos of your work and the completed application form. Please don't send samples of your work. Also include a self address stamped envelope if you want your photos returned. Mail to Southeast Idaho Farmers' Market, P.O. Box 4308, Pocatello, Idaho 83205.
- We do not expect you to include every item you will be selling in the pictures you submit. We only need to see a representation of your work.
- You will be notified by mail or phone of the jury's decision within 7-10 days. All jury decisions are final for the market season. Please don't bring your work to the market for approval, you will be asked to submit an application through the mail.
